



On Saturday, March 23, 2019, the Girls Scouts of Central Texas and the ASU College of Science & Engineering sponsored a STEM Conference at ASU. Among the workshops that were held that day were one held by Dr. Kathryn Louie on "The Chemistry of Art," and one held by Dr. Edith Osborne, Dr. Greg Smith, and Mr. Kevin Boudreaux on "Solar-Powered Fun!" (in which

the kids were able to make dye-sensitized solar cells with titanium dioxide, graphite, and crushed blackberries).


On Saturday, April 13, 2019, the ASU student group participated in an "Art and Science Family Day" at the San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts. They made "shrinky-dinks" by heating pieces of polystyrene plastic (recycle code 6), which were colored by the kids, to make pendants. They also demonstrated the use of biodegradable corn starch packing peanuts, in contrast to non-biodegradable polystyrene packing peanuts. Two Chemistry Magic Shows were also performed that day.
